Swedish singing sensation Therese According to the Jumeirah greets HELLO! at the door of her Jumeirah her best Beach Residence home carrying her best accessory yet, her blue-eyed baby boy.

Dressed in Ferrari World-emblazoned attire, 10-month-old Lucas puts his hands together every time he hears his mother's name, as does the firm following of worldwide fans looking forward to the release of the former dancer's second album in February next year.

Therése, who has her own record label called Future Records through Warner Music, has enjoyed chart success, particularly in the US, performed with the likes of British band Simply Red and worked with top Swedish songwriter Jörgen Elofsson - who has penned tracks for the likes of Britney Spears, Irish boy band Westlife and US singer Kelly Clarkson. She has also turned her hand to acting, working on a TV series alongside Hollywood hero Ben Affleck.

Splitting her time between homes in Sweden, LA and Dubai for the last four years, Theresé, whose father is Lebanese, is keen to stay in touch with Arabic culture.

Her face glowing with excitement for her forthcoming album, HELLO! soaks up some talent at home with Therese Neaime.

Tell us about your new album.

"It will be released worldwide in the spring and is a mix of international modern pop with an Arabian flavour. I think that music develops throughout a person's career so this album takes my music to the next level."

You write your own songs, where do you find your inspiration?

"My songs always tell a story. I find inspiration from everyday life, from my friends and family. I think the best songs are always songs that are

What was your very first song about?

"My very first song was called How Could You Leave Me? I moved to Hollywood to study music and I wrote it in my studio there. I had left my boyfriend at the time to pursue my passion, so I wrote it from his perspective. It was a really tough song to write, but I was quite proud when it was featured in a Swedish movie called Language of Love.

When did you decide to pursue a career in singing?

What has been your most memorable Dubai performance?

It has to be the What's On Awards. I've been a headline singer at the event for the last three years and I love it. I sing in front to the crème de la crème of the industry. It's amazing.'

"We worked together on a TV series called Push Nevada for Touchstone Hollywood in LA. He was great, he cared about everyone on set and I was actually surprised that he always arrived on
